PASTORAL LETTER

Church,

In what I suppose is one of the nicer hotel bars in Cambodia, Stephen and I sat near dusk after a long day of travel and ministry, and we shared an Angkor—the pride of the Khmer people much as Shiner Bock is for Texans. It was January, so it was a mild 90 degrees and the light lager was refreshing. It was over this light beer that I made the case for Stephen to partner with me on mission in our city for the long haul. Being a skilled linguist, he had picked up on the Khmer language in just a few days, so naturally the missionaries were making their pitch for him to stay!

Here's the pitch I made. I think God is on the brink of doing something at New St. Peter's that is special, to conform us more and more to the image of Jesus and to the imagining of the picture of his church in heaven: people from every nation (and state!) who are coming to our city to study, to work, to find refuge, prosperity, and hope. In this time and place, we have a strategic opportunity to invite people into life on the road with Jesus right here in our international mission field.

What about native Dallasites? I am one after all, and quite proud of it. But all of us need to know that for as much as we love our city, the things we love about it really are echoes from heaven, and more to come as we pray "Your kingdom come!"

This capital campaign is about the people, place, and mission God has for us, and I wholeheartedly believe that White Rock Skate is the place. This property will give us opportunities for Christian hospitality like we've not yet known. It will serve as a hub for diaconal and mercy ministry and outreach, and it will even help to galvanize and clarify our scattered parish outreach. It will also help us to steward one of the most precious resources we have been entrusted with: our covenant children. We are bursting at the seams with children, and we need space to nurture them on the Christian journey, to allow for places to play, to grow, and to engage beyond just Sunday mornings.

I hope that you have seen the genuine efforts of so many on our property team and have joined us in imagining what Christ's kingdom could look like in this little corner of our city. I would like to invite you now to join our leadership, including Alicia and me, in giving sacrificially according to all the Lord has given to you.

One final note...as you have heard, we will contribute a percentage of our campaign funds to MTW Cambodia to build a church building in the Smith's Village. New St. Peter's has deep roots with the Smiths in Cambodia, and I am so excited to return one day and see a church building for the saints there which was made possible by your generosity!

HISTORY OF NSP

New St. Peter's was planted in 2003 with the hope of being a Reformed and Presbyterian church for the Lake Highlands and broader northeast Dallas communities. From our earliest days, the vision was always to have a place of our own that compliments the high value of worship at New St. Peter's, along with our new core values of calling, suffering, and membership. We believe White Rock Skate is that place.

As you might have noticed, we are bursting at the seams with children and families, and we need the space to shepherd them faithfully! Since we have begun the School of Life and Doctrine (Sunday school) on Sunday mornings, we are already in need of more children's space! This property has ample space that will be dedicated for a children's wing in order to serve our young families well. It will also allow for space for men's and women's Bible studies, a large lobby for fellowship, and our growing youth group. There are also great operational benefits to owning a place of our own: no more weekly set up and tear down and plenty of time to expand our programs and have post-worship fellowship!

But perhaps the most exciting thing to imagine is the outreach that can happen from this place. The property is surrounded by apartments with opportunities to reach the physical and spiritual needs of our neighbors. It gives us a presence in a neighborhood, a place to invite pilgrims and skeptics into our community. We want this property to serve as a community center on the town square.





For more than a year, over a dozen people have been at work to understand this property and present what we know to the church. So, what is next? We are asking you to join the property committee, staff and session in praying for and supporting this work. It is exciting to imagine what the Lord may do among us as we move toward a permanent home from which we could minister not just on Sundays but throughout the week. May the Lord guide and direct our hearts as we seek to be obedient to his will.

SITE PLAN









FLOOR PLAN

COST OVERVIEW

Purchase Price | \$ 4,850,000

This price has been negotiated with the seller together with a 7-year interest-only loan and a down payment of \$1,250,000. There is no prepayment penalty on that loan.

Construction Costs | \$ 2,300,000

An estimate based on renovations to the existing facility and grounds.

Contingency, Financing, & Current Leases | \$1,200,000

Will help cover fluctuations in *construction costs*, *financing* on the new space, and *rent* of our current spaces (the Dallas Children's Theater and our office space).

Capital Campaign & Due Diligence | \$ 200,000

Fees related to inspections and various studies on the property (such as HVAC, environmental, etc.) as well as fees for the running of our capital campaign.

TOTAL COSTS | \$ 8,550,000



As part of our ongoing partnership with MTW Cambodia, New St. Peter's will give a percentage of all funds raised toward the project to build a church building in the Smith's village in Cambodia. This building will serve as a ministry hub in Angkjeay village—housing after-school ESL classes, Bible studies, living quarters for interns and short-tern teams, and weekly Sunday worship.





CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

A capital campaign has certain unique features, distinguishing it from annual giving.

- It is in response to a matter of *SIGNIFICANT* need and, therefore, takes place *ONLY* when necessary.
- It invests its returns typically in **PERMANENT PROPERTIES.**
- It seeks much larger amounts of money than a planned budget can meet.
- It requires planned *SACRIFICIAL* and *INSPIRATIONAL* effort, often involving gifts of annuities, real estate, stocks, life insurance, IRAs, securities, or other assets.
- The Bible speaks of equal sacrifice in our giving, not equal gifts.
- A pledge is a faith commitment. It is what you believe you can give to support this campaign. It is not a contract.
